

Step-by-Step Guide to Using RWHOA.com as a Homeowner

There are some private documents the general public who are not homeowners in River Wilderness will not have access to these documents but having them accessible on the website helps us stay in compliance of Florida State Law.

★ How to REGISTER for an account

👉 Step 1:

Go to your computer, tablet, or phone.
Open the internet browser (like Chrome, Safari, Edge).

👉 Step 2:

In the white bar at the top, the address bar type this:

rwhoa.com

This is the URL or address to see the community website.
After typing it in press Enter on your keyboard.

👉 Step 3:

Look for a button or link that says:
"Register"
or
"Create Account"

👉 Step 4:

Click on it.
A form will open.

How to pick a USERNAME and PASSWORD

USERNAME

This is like your online nickname.

You can use your name or something simple that describes who you are:

MarySmith / GolfFan123

PASSWORD

This is your secret key to keep your account safe.

Use at least 8 letters/numbers.

Try something easy for you, but hard for strangers. Like:

SunnyOak!45 a favorite song from your childhood or a phrase you are familiar with.

Write it down on a notepad so you don't forget!

 Then click Submit or Create Account.

🔑 How to LOGIN

Once you have registered you will be able to login using your username and password after your account is verified by the RWHOA board roster. This ensures that only homeowners have access to sensitive information meant for our community only.

👉 Step 1:

Go back to rwhoa.com.

👉 Step 2:

Look for "Login" or "Sign In" at the top.

👉 Step 3:

Click it. You'll see two boxes:

[USERNAME]

[PASSWORD]

👉 Step 4:

Type in the username and password you picked.

Click Login.

🎉 You're in!

Log Out

■ 4. How to LOG OUT when you're done

👉 Look at the top right corner (or sometimes in a menu).

It may say: "Log Out"

or "Sign Out"

👉 Click it.

That's it — you're safely logged out!

 Extra tips

- If you forget your password, click “Forgot Password” and follow the steps.
- Keep your password written down somewhere safe.
- If you ever feel stuck, ask a family member or neighbor for help — or email the HOA support team.
